



# One week to highlight minorities' representation in the media The third edition of the European Week of Media and Minorities took place from the 20<sup>th</sup> March to the 26<sup>th</sup> 2006

Dedicated radio broadcasting, media monitoring activities, seminars and conferences, sensitization campaigns, TV shows and interviews. Those and many others are the initiatives undertaken in 12 EU countries by 19 different organizations that joined the European Week of Media and Minorities, from 20<sup>th</sup> March to the 26<sup>th</sup> 2006. The objective of the different activities was shared by all the participants: promoting public dialogue about representation of minority groups in the European media and empowering minority audiences.

The European Week of Media and Minorities (EWMM) was launched three years ago by Online/More Colour in the Media, the European network for media and diversity based in the Netherlands.

# Austria
